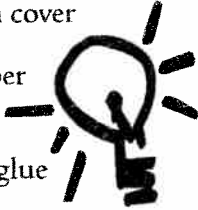

# LIGHT SWITCH COVER

Everyone who believes in God and lives for him is a child of light. Make this cover for your bedroom light switch to remind you to be a light for God.

### What you need:

- An adult to help
- Light switch cover
- Screwdriver
- Colored paper
- Markers
- Scissors
- Decoupage glue
- Paintbrush
- Craft knife



### What you do:

1. Remove the screws from the cover.
2. On the paper, draw small images related to light and write out "Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8, NIV).
3. Cut out the drawings and verse. Make sure they'll fit on the cover.
4. Paint the cover with a coat of decoupage glue, and then immediately place the drawings and verse on the cover.
5. Paint over them with another coat of glue. Let it dry.
6. Turn the cover over and use a craft knife to cut out the opening for the light switch.
7. Using a screwdriver, place your new light switch cover on your wall.

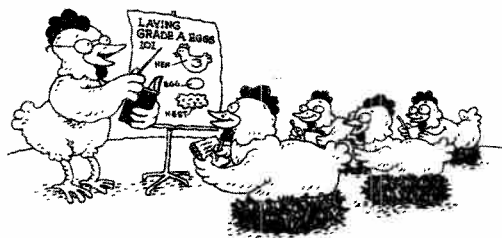

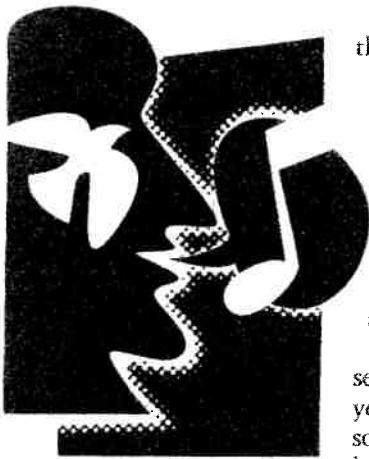

On February 4, 1968, exactly two months before Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated, he delivered his last sermon at Atlanta's Ebenezer Baptist Church. In it, he described his preferences for his own funeral. He didn't want people to mention his Nobel Peace Prize, his other awards or where he went to school; none of that was important, he said. Instead, he wanted his eulogist to say that King "tried to give his life serving others" and "tried to love somebody."

In that sermon, King also said "everybody can serve," regardless of background or educational level. The only requirements, he said, were "a heart full of grace" and "a soul generated by love."

## From humble beginnings

In 1804, William, a 21-year-old from a poor family, decided to go to New York City to find a job. He told a neighbor his plans, saying he knew how to make soap and might work in a soap factory.

The neighbor said, "Just remember to be a good man, give your heart to Christ and pay the Lord all that belongs to him. Give a dime of every dollar you make, make an honest soap and you will be a happy and wealthy man."

Sure enough, William found a job making soap. Later, he became part owner and then sole owner of the business. His product line — and giving — expanded greatly. He gave many millions of dollars to the Lord's work throughout the world, far more than 10 percent of his wealth.

William Colgate died in 1857 at age 74, but his legacy and company, Colgate-Palmolive, still thrive.

Gifted pianist and comedian Victor Borge once said the shortest distance between two people is laughter. He was right. Laughter does indeed quickly break down barriers.

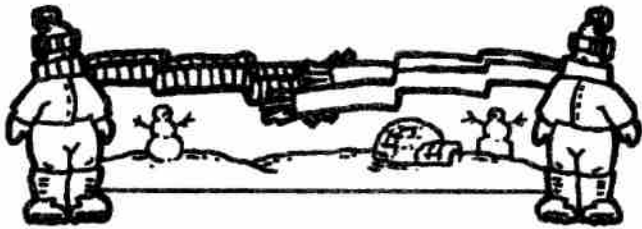
Collect a few stories that make you laugh and have them ready when an occasion calls for more intimacy.

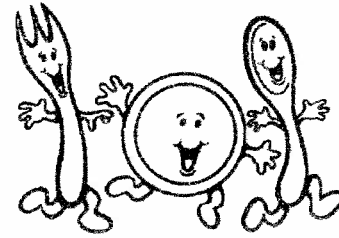

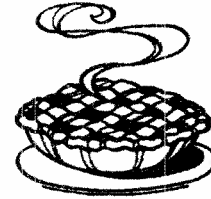

During the month of December, fifty-seven households were served at the Pantry for a total of 150 individuals. There were six new households which included 13 individuals.

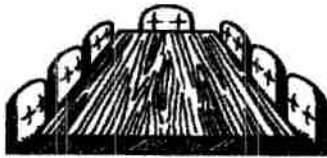

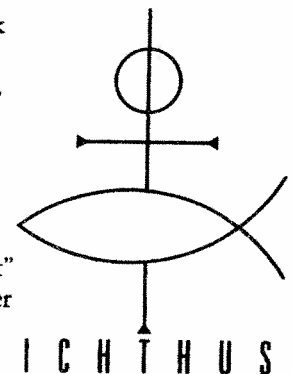
Our pastor's office is in need of a desk and book shelves. Mac and the property committee are working on this. A letter of resignation was received by Don Wilkinson.

### Fish

The first letters in the Greek phrase "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior" spell ICHTHUS, or fish. Early Christians used the sign to convey their faith and avoid persecution. 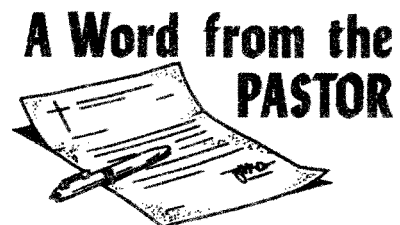

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Merry Christmas!!! Wow...what a busy month for the Church. A big round of thanks to all who made this blessed holiday season one to remember. The church decorators, the Trinity Ringers, the Choirs, the Christmas Pageant participants, Christmas Carolers, and last but not least, the "cleaning crew" who made our church spotless, at least for a few days. It all says one thing...people are joining together and participating in many and varied ways.

As we begin a new year, our work is just beginning. Pastor Rich officially joins us January 1, even though he has been actively involved in many congregational activities since mid-November. One of our first tasks as a congregation will be to do some sort of assessment of our strengths and our weaknesses and develop goals and action plans for the future. We are not sure in what form this assessment will be done but cottage meetings may be one of the tools we may use to share and gather information. Your comments and recommendations are welcomed so please give us your feedback. We will most likely resurrect the "Church Mouse" suggestion box so look for it appearing soon. Understandably not everyone will agree with this approach but we need to give this exercise ample time to fully evaluate its effectiveness.

Another way to gather information has been our brainstorming session at the Family Retreat. This year's retreat will be held at Camp Nawakwa March 11 - 12. Put this date on your calendar. We would like to have more Youth attending so we will be looking at ways to "entice" the youngsters to join in the activities (with or without the parents).

As previously mentioned there is no shortage of things to do so please VOLUNTEER and play an active role in Trinity's future. May God's Blessing be with us all, as we begin our new year which will be full of new challenges and opportunities.
